Interview: Yad Sarah's Southern **Regional Manager**

BRANCHING OUT

ad Sarah's 126+ branches support almost every family in Israel. Each branch is managed and operated by volunteers.

Today we focus on the Kiryat Shmona, Netanya and Tel Aviv branches to learn about the men and women volunteering their time to provide compassionate care to the people of Israel.



ZEVIK GLIDAI Branch Manager, Kiryat

I have been volunteering at Yad Sarah for 38 years and am deeply dedicated to the community in Kiryat Shmona. On October 20, 2023, I had to evacuate my home for the first time due to the war.

In the first few months of the war, my wife and I lived with my daughter in the Galilee region while her husband was called to reserve duty. I was also called up and served more than 40 days in the IDF's Casualties Center.

However, I want to continue serving my local community so I have recently been staying in the Western Galilee community of Sde Ilan. While the area is relatively safe, I often travel 45 minutes from my temporary home to the Yad Sarah branch in Kiryat Shmona.

The city is essentially a ghost town, which is a bit disconcerting. However, those unable to evacuate rely on Yad Sarah's services—which are even more essential now that individuals in the region have become isolated from most outside services.

As we face the threat of escalation from Hezbollah and Iran, I remain committed to supporting my local community. I have no intention whatsoever to leave the North, even after the war—it's not even a question.

For example, before there was a Yad Sarah branch in Majdal Shams, members of the Druze community would come in to borrow and return medical equipment. Often, when they returned the equipment, they offered volunteers fruit as a thank you.

ad Sarah—Israel's leading volunteerled social service organization—is an essential provider of medical, social, and rehabilitative support services to soldiers and civilians in the country. Following Hamas' attacks on Oct 7 and the subsequent war, Yad Sarah's role has become even more vital.

When conflict erupted, Yad Sarah adapted to meet the pressing demands of a nation in turmoil by arranging for evacuations from combat zones, initiating a soldier rehabilitation program, increasing the capacity of its home hospital program, launching an emergency oxygen campaign, and much more to provide essential support to those affected by the war.



Now, a year after the devastating attack at the Nova Music Festival and the communities surrounding the Gaza envelope, Yad Sarah continues to support those impacted by the war in an

increased capacity to support the welfare of all people in Israel.

Yad Sarah continues to support those impacted by the war in an increased capacity

At present, one of Yad Sarah's key areas of focus is soldier rehabilitation. As of August 2024, more than 10,000 Israel Defense Forces (IDF) soldiers* have been treated by the Israel Defense Ministry Rehabilitation Department—for conditions ranging from post-traumatic stress disorder to physical injuries.

To support IDF soldiers, Yad Sarah launched a Soldier Rehabilitation program which facilitates the organization's services to active and reserve soldiers. To date, the department has aided in the rehabilitation and recovery of more than 2,500 soldiers by providing medical equipment and home care support services.

Ari is a combat soldier who ducked to the ground to dodge bullets while fighting in Gaza. He injured his knee and, despite the pain, continued to fight on the battlefield. Eventually, the pain became unbearable, and Ari was brought back to Israel for a medical evaluation where doctors discovered he had suffered tendon damage in his leg.

He underwent surgery but was unable to stand or put pressure on his leg. Once Ari returned home, he reached out to Yad Sarah for a CPM device to aid in his recovery process, as recommended by his doctor.

"I had heard there was a soldier in Rehovot who needed a home delivery—and I live not far away so I delivered it to him," said Eitan Dahari, head of Yad Sarah's Logistics Division. "We'll be here if [Ari] needs anything - medical equipment or support during his rehabilitation process, or [anything else] in the future."

Eitan and more than 7,000 Yad Sarah volunteers offer this level of compassionate care to everyone in need.

"Each volunteer we encountered was cheerful and efficient even at the end of the day, expressing a genuine desire to go above and beyond in helping others," recalls Rivka, whose son, Moshe, and six of his fellow IDF soldiers were injured in a firefight with terrorists in Gaza.

Miraculously, Moshe and his fellow soldiers survived the ordeal and were




soldier.

rapidly transported to the Barzilai Medical Center in Ashkelon where they underwent treatment. Moshe suffered from a severe arm injury and was hospitalized for two weeks. Once released, his mother searched for a wrist brace but was shocked by the high cost. A friend referred her to Yad Sarah, where she received a brand new wrist brace with customized straps for her son, all at a nominal cost.

"In addition to the direct help the brace provides, we received a warm feeling knowing everyone wants to go the extra mile and work as efficiently as possible to help," she remarked.

Yad Sarah's commitment to aiding those affected by the war extends beyond the battlefield.

While the organization has dedicated significant resources to rehabilitating soldiers like Ari and Moshe, it works to meet the needs of all the people of Israel. Whether on the front lines or in the heart of civilian communities, Yad Sarah is driven by a singular purpose: to provide compassionate care to anyone in need, regardless of age, background, or circumstance. This mission was particularly evident in the aftermath of the devastating attack on Majdal Shams in late July 2024.

After Hezbollah's attack killed 12 young children on a soccer field and injured dozens of others, Yad Sarah's northern division acted quickly to mobilize resources and provide critical support and unwavering assistance to those in dire need.

The Majdal Shams branch opened in March 2024 and is managed by Mansur

Said Ahmad, a member of the Majdal Shams Druze community. Mansur first became acquainted with Yad Sarah and its services in 2014 while recovering from a complicated leg surgery. During his extensive rehabilitation, Mansur traveled more than 18 miles to Kiryat Shmona, where the then-closest Yad Sarah branch was located,

to borrow the medical equipment necessary for his recovery. This experience sparked his determination to establish a branch closer to home and his initiative has proved timely.

"We have the responsibility to extend a hand to help everyone deal with the way life is now. The people who come to us are from all walks of life

n October 7, 22-year-old Bar Kupershtein was working as a security guard at the Nova music festival. When sirens began sounding throughout the country, his family called Bar to check in but did not get an answer.

A few hours later, his aunt found photos and videos online—posted by Hamas terrorists of Bar tied up on the ground. Since his kidnapping nearly a year ago, the family has not seen or heard from Bar.

To support the Kupershtein family during this difficult time, Yad Sarah is transporting Bar's father-who lives in Holon, outside of Tel Aviv-to and from doctor appointments, visits to Hostage Square, and more, in the organization's wheelchair-accessible vans.

AN INTERVIEW WITH GOLAN LAMENATZEACH

Yad Sarah Southern **Regional Manager**

YS: HI GOLAN, IT IS NICE TO MEET YOU! CAN YOU TELL ME A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF?

GOLAN: I was born in Tel Aviv 49 years ago and now live in Susya with my family. I served as a combat soldier in the IDF, and now—in addition to working as the Yad Sarah Southern Regional Manager—I am in the IDF's rabbinate unit where I manage logistics and religious equipment.

Since early October 2023, I have been working at Yad Sarah during the day and spending my nights on IDF reserve duty.

YS: WHAT WAS YOUR EXPERIENCE ON OCT. **7TH**?

Living in the South, I was in a highly impacted area. At the time, I didn't fully understand the terror that was taking place. And, like everyone else, I didn't realize that day would be as

significant as it has become, or that it would reach the level of our worst nightmares.

On one of my first days back at Yad Sarah after October 7th, I was taking oxygen supplies to the elderly in Netivot and drove past the site of the tour bus that was

attacked. I looked around and devastatingly saw bodies scattered throughout the roads. It is an understatement to say that was a hard day.





As the community in the South continues to deal with the aftermath of October 7th, I am proud that Yad Sarah can support the recovery.

YS: AS THE SOUTHERN REGIONAL MANAGER, WHAT ARE YOUR PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES?

I am proud that Yad Sarah can support the recovery.

Currently, I oversee 28 branches and more than 1,200 volunteers throughout Israel's southern region. This territory spans from Rehovot to Eilat and includes major hubs such as Ashdod and Beersheva.

I regularly travel throughout the region, and since October 7th, have been attending to the hard-hit communities near the Gaza border. During Yad Sarah's initial emergency response to October 7th, I largely oversaw the logistics of equipment loans to evacuees in the South. Many of these evacuees tragically had their homes and belongings burned or were forced to abandon their lives in the South to find refuge in a safer area.

One of the more heavily affected cities in my region is Sderot, which I have been visiting frequently. I

have also worked with residents who survived the massacre at Kibbutz Be'eri and evacuees housed at hotels in the Dead Sea area.

In the South, there are many individuals in need and we coordinate

equipment loans and deliver at-home oxygen equipment and medical supplies to as many as possible.

YS: WHAT ARE THE BIGGEST NEEDS IN THE SOUTH RIGHT NOW?

Currently, rehabilitation equipment and services for soldiers and civilians are the biggest need. And providing equipment to individuals in the area is incredibly impactful.

One day, an injured young man came in for a pair

of crutches. After testing them out, he explained with gratitude that he sees these Yad Sarah crutches as his "new leg." This simple comment made me truly understand how valuable Yad Sarah's services are for our clients. I feel a great need to bring these items

to the injured and to help them return to some semblance of routine, mobility, and life.

In addition to equipment, I am also looking to recruit additional volunteers.

Many of our volunteers evacuated the region at the beginning of the war, and not all have returned yet. During Passover, I had a seder in Sderot with a group of volunteers who returned after being displaced for months.



I recently spoke with individuals who had evacuated to Tel Aviv, Jerusalem, and the Dead Sea hotels area. Each one explained that they felt out of place in a new city and looked for a place to volunteer and stay busy. The only place they could find was Yad Sarah, and volunteering with the organization gave them a constructive use of their time during the darkness.

Upon returning to Sderot, they continued to volunteer with Yad Sarah as the city's branch was serving residents who hadn't evacuated. Their lives had been turned upside down and said they didn't expect how much the return to volunteering would rehabilitate them.

YS: WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE THING ABOUT YOUR ROLE AS YAD SARAH'S SOUTHERN REGIONAL MANAGER?

One of the most wonderful things about Yad Sarah is that we meet with the people of Israel from every walk of life and every sector in Israel. This gives me the strength to keep going during this difficult time.

Since October 7th, I have felt a great sense of connection and community—something we need now more than ever. At Yad Sarah, we see this every day. Each branch helps unite individuals and return some normalcy to their daily lives.

Thanks to your continued support, Yad Sarah provides a vital array of compassionate health and home services for people of all ages and backgrounds. As Israel's largest volunteer-staffed organization, Yad Sarah's 7,000+ members work around the clock to assist almost every family in Israel.

The people of Israel — and people with special needs traveling to Israel — rely on Yad Sarah to help them remain independent, healthy and at home.

OUR PROGRAMS AND SERVICES INCLUDE:

Medical Equipment Lending Centers: An inventory of 361,914 items to be loaned out at no cost to the borrowers.

Conversations with the Homebound: Phone conversations to activate minds and raise morale of people isolated at home.

Medical Equipment Repairs: The medical equipment that Yad Sarah lends are repaired and renovated by skilled volunteers and people with disabilities.

Day Rehabilitation Centers: Physical and occupational therapy; computer, art, drama and gardening therapy; meals and social events for young and old recovering from strokes, surgery, illness, and injury.

Emergency Alarm System: Peace of mind for the elderly and homebound, 24 hours a day, with two-way transmitters connected to Yad Sarah's national computerized system.

Transportation Services: Wheelchair-accessible rides to work, school, medical appointments, and social occasions.


The Family Center: Professional therapy to individuals who have experienced trauma due to violence in the home.

Emergency Medical Center: Expert doctors in a variety of fields, highly qualified nurses, and top lab technicians provide a first-rate medical response to all.

Yad Riva Legal Aid: Legal services, legal counseling, legal representation, and social assistance for the elderly provided by volunteer lawyers.

Mobile Dental Clinic: A full range of specialized care for the homebound and elderly.

Home Hospitalization Service: Lending equipment to create a hospital room at home to allow recuperation among family, avoiding the discomforts and dangers of long-term hospital stays.
